MARGERY W. — Born May 31, 1907, 9:45 p.m., New York City.

Here is a combination for you: Uranus and Mars rising in the saturnine sign Capricorn. Margery is original to the finger tips, and she is not going to do things the way anybody else wants; she has a better way of her own, and she knows it. This may be very trying to her parents and her associates, but her way will be a good way in most cases, so it will be well to let her follow her own inclination. Venus, the planet of love, sextile to Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, makes her exceedingly kind and sympathetic. Sometimes the Mars-Uranus combination in opposition to Jupiter and Neptune may lead her into rash, impulsive acts of charity, and may cause her financial loss, but in the long run she will be the gainer in experience and golden treasure in heaven, and that is worth a whole lot more than the dross you have to leave behind when you shuffle off the mortal coil. She will never be a Hetty Green, for Saturn is in the second house ruling riches, and he always obstructs, but she will always have abundant means to satisfy her needs, for the luminaries, the Sun and Moon, are in trine, and Venus, the planet of attraction, is sextile to Jupiter, the planet of opulence. These aspects give her the money, and the last named also gives her the taste for spending it by fostering a love of the beautiful in dress and surroundings.

And where will her money come from? From her own efforts and ability, as shown by the planets in the first house, which gives her an unusual originality. This she will use in an educational work, as shown by the presence of the Sun and Mercury in the fifth house, trine to the Moon in the first. The first house signifies her own personal self in the most intimate sense, and the Moon is the planet of fecundation; as it moves around the zodiac it fructifies everything in all departments of life as denoted by the houses, and makes the opportunities grow and flower. It is trine to the Sun, which stands for those in authority: employers, or heads of business enterprises; also to Mercury, which is the planet of mind, speech, and writing. This configuration of the Sun, Moon, and Mercury occurs from Aquarius and Gemini, two intellectual, scientific signs. Gemini, where the Sun and Mercury are, is in the fifth house in this horoscope. The fifth house deals with public places of pleasure and amusement, also with literary publications and educational institutions. The nature of the configuration of the planets we are considering excludes the possibility of Margery's being connected with anything of a frivolous nature, and points to the educational aspect of the fifth house as her sphere of work. She will originate and carry to a successful accomplishment an educational work of some magnitude despite all opposition, notwithstanding that she will be stigmatized as a fool and a freak, as shown by the opposition of Uranus to Jupiter and Neptune in the seventh house, which denotes the public. She

will also have a hard time getting a start, for though Saturn is intercepted and cannot therefore make his obstructive influence fully felt in the second house, which governs finances, and although he is unaspected, there is always a cold hand over the department of life indicated by the house he is in. As said, though, the other influences for financial support are too strong to be more than temporarily checked by Saturn.

We have said that the disposition of Margery is basically kind, loving, and affectionate, as shown by Venus in her home sign Taurus, sextile to Jupiter in his exaltation sign, Cancer. At times, however, the impulsiveness and irritability of Uranus and Mars in Capricorn may change her entirely for the time being. There is a temper and difficulty in getting over it, a tendency to hold spite, which should be dealt with in the early years. Would that we had had the chance to cast this horoscope at birth, and instruct you regarding this trait of character, for it is already well settled. However, you still have a chance to work on her to eradicate it, and if you can, it will save her many an hour of brooding over what she has said and done in one of those moods. It is so difficult for a character like this to admit being in the wrong and to make up, so the best way is to avoid being irritable and impulsive. Self-control is learned in the earlier years of life to an extent not apprehended by educators, and if taught then saves much sorrow in later life. Be sure to see that if she has had a quarrel with anyone, she makes up as soon as possible, and that she must forgive

and forget with her whole heart.

Jupiter, the planet of opulence, benevolence, and munificence, in Cancer, the sign which rules the stomach, makes the person generous to himself where food is concerned. In other words, there is a strong tendency to overeat, and when we consider this indication with the opposition of Uranus and the conjunction of Neptune, it is plain that Margery must not be allowed to satisfy her appetite for food, or she will become dyspeptic and her life will be made miserable in consequence. Teach her to be frugal, and be sure that you teach her by example, and not by precept, for it cannot be expected that she will learn to like plain food and be satisfied with it if she sees you indulge in the delights of the table.

BARBARA S. — Born March 2, 1912, 2 a.m., Waterbury, Conn.

Here we find Jupiter rising in his own sign, Sagittarius, in sextile with Venus, the planet of attraction and love. This shows the aspiring nature of the Ego entering life under that configuration, and an innate kindly disposition. Unfortunately, however, she will lack the power of expressing her feelings, for Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is in Taurus, the sign which governs the vocal organ, and square to Venus, the ruler of Taurus. This will lead people to suppose that she is cold and calloused, when, as a matter of fact,

her heart is aching with love which she is powerless to express. Goaded to desperation by the attitude of her associates, and stung to the quick by their unmerited reproach, the opposition of Mars, the energizer, to Jupiter, and his square with Mercury, the planet of expression, cause her to lose her temper and voice her resentment in a manner that will seem to justify the estimate formed of her by the people in her environment.

This is a cheerless delineation; it wrings the astrologer's heart to write it, and were it not that the life is still so young, and that we ardently believe in the power of man to rule his stars, no power on earth could force us to write this horoscope. But we know that there are many unfortunate people of just such a disposition as this child, who go through life misunderstood and alone, and we rejoice at the privilege of showing Barbara's parents her true inner nature so that they may give her the love she needs more than life, and save her from the fate of others whose relatives judge only by outer appearances.

It is not enough, however, that the parents should excuse, or pass over, her seeming indifference and lack of affection, because of a belief that she feels it in her heart. That would only be half-hearted help. You must teach her to show her feelings so that all can see them; that is the only way you can save her from being misjudged by others and eventually becoming embittered towards all mankind. Teach her to show you how much she loves her doll and her kitten, to hug

and caress them; encourage demonstrations of love toward brothers and sisters or other companions. You still have three of the precious seven years in which the habits of life are formed, and you must work with her early and late, in season and out of season; you must put your whole heart into the task of bringing her out of herself. You can do it, and your reward will be sure when you have brought her out of "prison." Some day you will hear the Master say: "I was in prison and you freed me; enter into the joy prepared for you." It is said that "man's necessity is God's opportunity." Those Egos who come to us with good, strong, and virile horoscopes, who consequently grow up in the loveliest manner imaginable, are usually regarded as great blessings to parents. So they are, but when an Ego who is in dire need of help comes to a home, it offers to the parents an opportunity for service and soul-growth difficult to equal. You have here, in Barbara, a chance that the Angels might envy, We trust that you will utilize it nobly; nay, we feel you will, for there must be some fine gold in your hearts to have attracted this needy one.

Saturn, the planet of obstruction, in the fifth house, which governs courtship, and square to Venus, the planet of love, makes it unlikely that a marriage will be consummated in this life. That is well, for you will find the menses obstructed and there would be great difficulty in parturition. Saturn in Taurus also gives liability to cold in the throat, and by reflex action through the opposite sign, Scorpio, a tendency to con-

stipation. Encourage her to outdoor exercise, let her sleep out-of-doors if possible, and give her as nourishing a diet as possible. She needs it very much till she has passed the period of adolescence, at any rate.

MARY A. B. — Born Feb. 9, 1916, 4 a.m., Philadelphia.

Here we find the aspirational sign Sagittarius on the ASC, and therefore Jupiter, the planet of benevolence and kindness, is ruler. He is essentially dignified or strengthened by being placed in his other sign, Pisces, and conjoined with Venus, the planet of harmony and love, which is exalted in this sign. Both Jupiter and Venus are trine to Neptune, the planet of spirituality, which is placed in Leo, the sign of the heart. Thus we may conclude that Mary's basic nature is aspiring, spiritual, and lovable, but there is also another side to her as shown by the opposition of Mars, the planet of fiery passion, in Leo, the sign of the heart, to the Sun and the spasmodic Uranus.

Mary is not wishy-washy by any means, and if anything happens that is not to her liking, you will hear from her in no uncertain terms. She has the moral courage to express herself, and that is by no means a bad thing when one is otherwise mentally balanced. Too many are afraid of standing up for a principle. The worst part, however, is that whenever Mary allows herself to take a decided stand, she will

become too wrought up, and her health will suffer.

Saturn, the whip-lash of most people, is singularly tied in Mary's horoscope. He is weak in Cancer, which is the sign of his detriment, and Cancer is intercepted, limiting his power to hurt. He is also unaspected, however, so he will not be allowed to scourge her. Freed from the cold, restraining hand of Saturn, she will respond the more readily to the fiery energy of Mars, and burn herself out in enthusiasm wherever she directs her energies. Naturally, this will mean speedy exhaustion of her vitality, and unless she is carefully guided, her health will be endangered. We always preach against repression; the everlasting "don't" directed at children by a certain class of parents is the bane of many a life, but there are cases where the parents may play the role of Saturn with great benefit to the child. In fact, by supplying the energy of a weak Mars, instilling energy into an indolent child, we are helping it to overcome a disability and rule its stars. By playing up Venus in the horoscope of a child whose Mars in Scorpio squares Saturn (making it cruel), we shall help it, and it is just as legitimate to play up Saturn in the horscope of a child where that is lacking. Only, we must be very careful how we do it, for it is like giving poison for a curative purpose. The doses must be carefully modulated. One may give an enormous amount of Venus love, or the Jupiter friendliness and comradeship, without fear of administering an overdose, but it requires great circumspection to drive someone with the whip of Mars and not to be too cruel,

or to hold him in the leash of Saturn and not run the risk of becoming a kill-joy. So your task is difficult, requiring the use of all your love and common sense to guide yourself in this work. See that Mary learns the lesson of self-restraint, for that is very necessary to preserve her health and mental poise.

The Moon square Neptune predisposes to contact with the invisible worlds and the beings which live therein. As the aspect is inharmonious you will understand that this tendency, if fostered, will bring her some undesirable experiences, probably development of mediumship. For that reason do not allow her to come in contact with psychics or attend spiritualistic circles. Do your best to make her surroundings bright and cheerful in the earliest years, for the saturnine sign Capricorn always disposes to gloom, which the atmosphere of childhood may do much to modify.

With respect to health, we have already hinted that the heart action is apt to be irregular on account of Mars' placement in Leo, the sign which rules the heart, in opposition to Uranus. But remember, nearly all children are strong and healthy. It is the abuse of the body that causes the weak spots to show. Now you have the immense advantage of knowing that her heart needs protection to keep it well and strong, and if that is given during the years of growth, chances are that you may some day say: "Oh, I do not believe that there was anything in what that astrologer said; her heart is as strong as an ox." In the meantime, it will do no harm to apply the ounce of prevention.

ROSALYND W. McL. — Born July 29, 1914, 12:15 p.m. Pittsburgh, Pa.

Here we have an illustration of what has often been said about the ruler of a horoscope, namely, that it is not necessarily the ruler of the ASC. The ruler must be strong and well placed; it must be receiving a number of aspects; for it is the aspects that determine a planet's influence, no matter whether they are good or bad. In Rosalynd's horoscope, Venus is ruler of the ASC; she is elevated, in conjunction with Mars, and sextile Mercury. That is good, and she will without doubt have considerable influence in the life. From Venus, Rosalynd will obtain an uncommon command of language; her power of expression will be forceful, and at the same time it will have an unusual beauty. The only danger is that Mars may, under adverse directions, cause her to be a little impulsive in her utterances.

But see Mercury; he is placed in the ninth house which rules the higher mind. In one of his signs, Gemini, we find Saturn, who is trine to the Moon. As so often said, Saturn is most beneficial when operating upon the mind — signified by Mercury, Moon, and the mercurial signs, also the third and ninth houses. This configuration will therefore give Rosalynd tact and diplomacy of the first order, the tendency to impulsiveness spoken of in the last paragraph being more than counteracted by this aspect, so she will

never give offence, and will be liked by everybody. From his other sign, Virgo, Mercury receives the support of Mars and Venus as already mentioned, and its elevation is considerably higher than that of Venus.

When we balance the claims to rulership of these planets we find that it is a very close race, with Mercury a little in the lead. It will be found that he will play an even more prominent part in Rosalynd's life than Venus, who rules the ASC. In other words, she will be a lovely character, with the added charm of a splendid intellect, and she will always be guided in her actions by reason. This prominence of reason is fortunate, for we find the Moon square to Neptune, which is in the psychic sign, Cancer, and the ninth house, the house of dreams and visions. Mercury is also there. From this configuration a tendency to dreams would develop, and they would run along an undesirable channel, to mediumship, were not Mercury so well fortified as already said. Be careful during childhood and youth not to let her attend circles or seances, or have anything to do with negative psychics, for the Moon square Neptune, and the Sun opposing Uranus, all from fixed signs, would make it hard for her to resist.

She will be well provided for in life, for the Moon is in the first house parallel Jupiter, the planet of opulence, and those who have the Sun near the MC rise accordingly in the social scale. As the Sun is in the sign Leo, which governs the heart, and the fifth house which deals with public institutions, she will

probably obtain a position as teacher and do well in it.

The Sun is in a nebulous spot known as the Ascelli, square with the Moon and opposition to Uranus. Thus there is a tendency to eye-trouble, and it is fortunate that we find it out so early, for it is always easier to apply the ounce of prevention than a pound of cure. Be sure to guard her from glaring sunlight, and anything which may strain the eyes in childhood and adolescence. It would be well to obtain advice from an oculist for the general care of the eyes, then you will have no difficulty, and she will easily outgrow this tendency. The Sun in Leo, the sign which governs the heart, square the flighty Moon and opposed by Uranus, the planet of spasmodic irregular action, will also interfere with the rhythm of the heartbeat and incline towards palpitation. However, as said with regard to the eyes, the ounce of prevention applied in childhood easily counterbalances any tendency to trouble. Then the body is still sound, and by the care of the weak spots, which can be known only through astrology, they are strengthened in the period of growth instead of being weakened by overexertion.

JOHN MILLER A. — Born April 23, 1911, 8:20 a.m., Spokane, Washington.

Here is a difficult child who needs a great deal of love and help from its parents, and we hope they will realize what an opportunity for service and soulgrowth has come to them in the care of this child. If they do, and act accordingly, all three will reap a rich harvest of treasure in heaven where neither moth nor rust can corrupt it.

John has Neptune on the Ascendant in the lunar, watery sign Cancer, sextile to the restless Mercury. The wandering Moon is also conjoined with the energetic Mars on the cusp of the watery sign Pisces, and even the staid Jupiter and the slow Saturn are in conjunction with the Moon's nodes, the Dragon's Head and Tail, to make John restless, like a horse chafing under its bit - stamping, pawing, and with every nerve quivering to be off, it matters not where, just so that he goes, goes, goes into the wide world. That is how John will feel, especially in the days of childhood, when he is under restraint and cannot get away. You may have to bear a great deal with him because he will want to run away, but do not punish him, no matter how often he does it. The poor child is driven from within, by a force that he can neither comprehend nor resist, so he cannot help running off any more than water can refrain from running down a hill. You cannot alter him in this respect, and it will be very much better, for both you and the child, if you try to work with him as he is, instead of as you think he ought to be.

John will be very moody and morose at best, on account of being unable to wander, as shown by Saturn, the planet of worry and gloom, in opposition to Jupiter, the planet of cheer, conjoined with the saturnine Dragon's Tail. If you can show him that you understand him and sympathize with him, he will run away less often, and if he knows he is not going to be punished he will return quicker, and will open up to you, so that maybe you can make arrangements with some campers out in the wilds which are not far from your home and he can go off to them. Then you will know where he is, and not be concerned about his safety. When he reaches the age where he can go off, he will probably want to go to sea, for you notice that the indications of this trait of character come from watery signs and the watery planets, Neptune and the Moon. Be sure, however, that you dissuade him in the most thorough manner from from ever entering the navy, for he will not be able to endure the feeling that he is obliged to stay there for a specified time. He would likely desert, a very serious thing, which might affect the rest of his life very detrimentally.

The Sun, giver of life and vitality, is sextile to Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, so John will grow up to be a strong, bright fellow with plenty of vim and energy. So long as he is not restrained he will also be cheerful, and escape the gloom indicated by Saturn opposition Jupiter. However, these planets will have an effect upon his health, and as they operate from Taurus, the sign which rules the throat, and Scorpio, the sign that has dominion over the generative and eliminative organs, we may conclude that these parts of the body will be affected. Saturn is obstructive, Jupiter is expansive; expansion of the glands in

the throat would mean enlarged tonsils and adenoids, and a similar condition in the rectum means piles. But if he can be kept dry and warm this trouble may be avoided. If throat infection does develop, do not have him operated upon; after puberty the trouble will pass away; the tonsils are necessary organs, which should not be removed.

LOUIS MARTIN P. — Born October 30, 1909, 2:10 a.m., Boston.

Here we have a youngster with common signs on the angles and the Moon in the ninth house in her exaltation-sign Taurus, showing him to be a born dreamer. Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, and Venus, the planet of love, are in mutual reception; that is to say, Jupiter is in Libra, a sign governed by Venus, and Venus is in Sagittarius, a sign governed by Jupiter. This shows that Louis' day dreams will be of a most beautiful and ideal nature; but unfortunately this world is a poor world for dreamers.

While it is perfectly true that if it were not for the dreamers there could be no progress in the world, it is also a fact that the world is only benefited by dreams in so far as the dreamers make their dreams come true. To do that requires action, generally in the face of criticism and skepticism such as most inventors have to face. This is where the parents must help Louis, for the common signs on the angles give him a tendency to waver and vacillate when he ought to take decisive action; and he needs your aid to root out the tendency. Teach him to help himself in everything he can possibly do and help others besides. Never do anything for him that is not entirely beyond his mental, moral, or physical strength; for by so doing you will enable him to work out his life to advantage instead of dreaming it away. There is one saving feature about this matter: the Sun is in the fixed, martial sign Scorpio, which helps to give considerable energy, and the Moon is in the stubborn sign Taurus, which helps to give persistence. The Moon is also sextile to Mars, the planet of dynamic energy; thus you have not an entirely common sign nature to work with, and there is plenty of energy latent which can be brought out by proper methods.

You will find that school will be very bothersome to Louis, but do not let that discourage you; everyone in the world cannot be an intellectual giant as yet, and people are needed in other vocations where the qualifications do not demand a great deal of book learning. With Jupiter and Venus in mutual reception, as already mentioned, he will enjoy an outdoor life. You will find that life on a cattle ranch or a stock farm will bring out all the good points physically, make him strong, healthy, and contented with life so that all the schooling he needs is just enough to give him sufficient insight in ordinary business matters. He will also do well in some occupation connected with travel, for the Moon is in her exaltation sign Taurus in the ninth

house, which has to do with travel, and sextile to Mars in the watery sign Pisces. Venus is in the other sign of travel, Sagittarius, with the mercurial sign Gemini on the Midheaven.

Be very careful to warn Louis never to have anything to do with spiritualism, for Neptune is in the psychic sign Cancer in opposition to Uranus. All the children that have been born under that configuration are naturally predisposed to psychic influences, and in Louis' horoscope we find that Neptune is also square to Saturn in Aries, which governs the head and brain, and square to Mercury which governs the concrete mind. From these indications it is very plain that if Louis were ever to become much interested in spiritualism, the disembodied entities in the invisible world would find him an easy prey for obsession from which it would be very difficult to free him.

With regard to his health: you should take care to see that he does not catch cold in the head. He is very apt to do that on account of the position of Saturn in Aries, and the opposition of Mercury in Libra shows that this will react in a nervous way upon the kidneys and affect the urinary system. Your climate is a rather strenuous one and the severe cold in the winter time will have a tendency to aggravate this trouble; therefore, as said, he should be given plenty of warm clothing so that the sensitive parts are protected.

DONALD B. — Born October 19, 1910, 11 p.m., Tres Pinos, Calif.

At Donald's birth we find the cardinal sign Cancer rising, and three other cardinal signs are on the angles, showing that his inherent nature is active and alert; but we find that there are five planets in and about the fourth house. When we see a grouping of the planets in a figure, we are sure that the nature will be expressed in the direction indicated by the house and sign involved. The fourth house stands for the home and the condition in old age, so it is evident that Donald is going to look out for a rainy day and see that when it comes his home is supplied in every respect; whatever vicissitudes may befall along the journey of life there will be no doubt about a snug harbor for the declining years.

There is one serious flaw in Donald's nature which is indicated by the planet Neptune in the fourth house home sign, Cancer, and on the ASC. He will not mingle freely with his fellowmen, but will try to shut himself off, and this will make him very unpopular. Mars in conjunction with Venus, the planet of love, and also with Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, shows a tendency towards despotism in the home. This, he should be taught in childhood days, always leads to disaster, for no home can be happy unless there is forbearance and tolerance of other people. It will not be so very difficult to eradicate this martial trait, for

Mercury, the significator of mind, is in conjunction with Venus, the planet of love, showing that he is really very kindly disposed toward those who compose the home circle. It is just a way he has about him of expressing himself too sharply in a manner which will give pain to others. The Moon, the other significator of mind, is in her exaltation-sign Taurus, which is ruled by Venus: this also shows the kindly disposition, and her trine to Uranus, the planet of intuition, taken together with her sextile to Neptune, shows a very high grade of inspirational capacity. Venus, the planet of the beautiful, is the mother of art through the sign Taurus; therefore, the Moon's position in that sign and configuration means that Donald's talents will find expression along artistic lines. The fact that Venus is at home in her other sign Libra, a sign of voice, and is trine to Mercury, the planet of speech, points to music in general and vocal music in particular, as the avenue of expression of Donald's talents.

With respect to health, we find that the Moon is in Taurus, the sign which governs the throat, and Neptune is in Cancer, the sign ruling the stomach, which is also a watery sign. Donald will therefore have a tendency to indulge in liquids, though not necessarily of an intoxicating nature, but he will crave an abundance of liquid, which of course, must be eliminated from the system. This is where the trouble will be, for we find Neptune square to Venus, Mars, Jupiter, and the Sun, all planets which are placed in Libra, the sign governing the kidneys. If the afflicted planets had been placed

in the earlier degrees of Libra, we should find that the trouble would be in the urethra; that is to say, the small tubes which go from the kidneys to the bladder; thus it would interfere with the secretion of the urine. But here we find that the afflicted planets are in the latter degrees of the sign Libra, and that means that the trouble will be with the elimination through the ureter, the duct which carries the urine from the bladder and outward. The fact that Mars is in that place and so afflicted shows that there will be plenty of room to pass the water, but it will scald and burn like fire. This testimony, is further augmented by the presence of the Sun, which is also square to Neptune. If Saturn had been the afflicted planet instead of Mars, his natural obstructiveness would have operated to close the ureter and thus produce a difficulty of elimination in another way.

Saturn is in Taurus, the sign which rules the throat, and he is unaspected, but nevertheless, wherever Saturn is found there is always some trouble. You will therefore find that Donald will take cold easily and that his throat will be the most sensitive point in his body. Therefore, be sure to do what you can to strengthen it during the years of childhood. Thus you will save him considerable trouble in later years.



LILLIAN A. — Born May 29, 1912, 3 a.m., New York City.

Here we have a little lady with a will of her own. "When she says she will, she will, and you can depend upon it; and when she says she won't, she won't, and that is the end of it," to quote an old doggerel. This we see from the stubborn sign Taurus rising with Saturn, the planet of persistence. Taurus is a sign of voice and we find Mercury, the planet of speech, there, opposed by the Moon, also significator of mind, from the martial sign Scorpio. This will give Lillian a tendency to talk more than necessary, and will also make her too critical of her surroundings. Saturn, the planet of obstruction, together with Venus, the planet of love, shows that it will be very difficult to understand Lillian. There is, as it were, two natures in her; one extremely lovable, and the other exceedingly selfish.

Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, is in the eighth house which has to do with legacies; it is parallel to the Sun and Neptune, also Mars, the planet of dynamic energy. This configuration of the Sun in the second house, which deals with finance, shows that Lillian will receive money by legacies; but as the aspects to the Sun and Jupiter are adverse, she should be extra careful how she expends money, for the tendency is to be reckless and indiscreet. If she allows this tendency to work itself out to reality she will reap sorrow from the house of finance. On account of the tendency to

reckless expenditures, it would be well for you to inculcate thrift from the very earliest childhood, for Neptune and Mars in the fourth house are not good omens for a cheerful old age, especially as Mars is opposed by Uranus.

You must not be discouraged for your child, however, for the stars show only tendencies. She has a very strong will, which it is your privilege to lead into the right channels so that the things which are disagreeable may be avoided by her during life. With Virgo in the sixth house and Libra intercepted, also the Moon in Scorpio, she is a born nurse, whether this tendency is expressed in the home to help others or in a vocational capacity.
